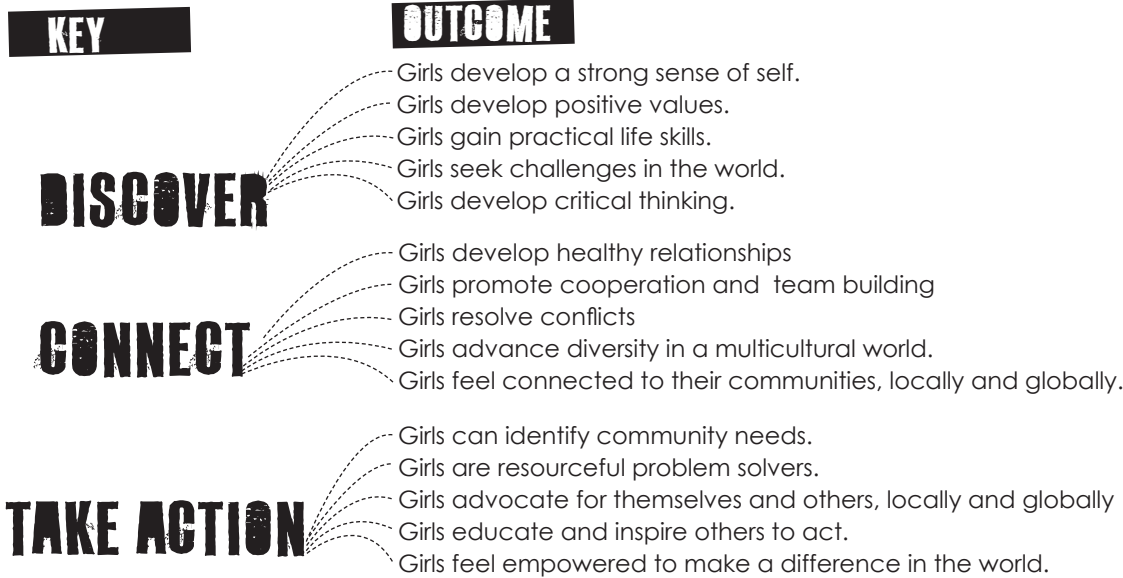

OPPORTUNITIES FOR ALL GIRL SCOUTS

All Girl Scouts can choose to participate in as many different Girl Scout activities as they wish. This list will give you an idea of the opportunities available and where to get more information.

PROGRAM EVENTS

These events are offered by the GSHCC program department to further a girl's experience in making new friends, gaining abilities, and enjoying learning outside of school. Girl Scout Juliettes can register to attend these events as long as an adult is available to attend with them. Event descriptions and details can be found on our Web site: www.girlscoutshcc.org. New events are added regularly. Registration may be done online or you may print a registration form from our Web site which can be mailed or faxed. You may also request a hard copy of the registration form. Be sure to register before the billing date since many programs fill rapidly. Financial aid is available and forms can be found online or you may request a copy.

SPECIAL EVENTS

During the year there are additional opportunities for special registration events hosted by collaborating organizations such as Raging Waters, Sacramento Kings, Modesto Nuts, Stockton Ports, and many more places. Details and registration forms for these added events can be found in the Program & Events section of our Web site under Special Events.

PRODUCT PROGRAMS

Information will be mailed to Girl Scout Juliettes in September for the fall product program, which takes place during the month of October. This includes the sale of nuts, chocolates, and magazine subscriptions. The Girl Scout Cookie

program information will be mailed to Girl Scout Juliettes in early December. The Girl Scout Cookie program takes place January through March.

CAMPS

All Girl Scouts register individually for camp. The Resident Camp Brochure listing all the "sleep away" camp opportunities at our council's Resident Camp, Camp Menzies, will be mailed in January. All Girl Scouts register individually for camp making it a great place to make new Girl Scout friends. Girl Scouts that will be entering second grade, or above, can choose to attend 3-10 day sessions at our resident camp. Resident Camp registration opens February 1st.

The Day Camp information listing the day camp, twilight camp and Service Unit run resident camp opportunities for the council will be posted on our Web site in February and an informational email will be sent. Girl Scouts can attend a day camp near their home for several days to a week in length. Day Camp registration opens on March 1st.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Sharing with others and giving back to the community is an important part of the Girl Scout program. Girls that are interested in finding out about local community service opportunities should check the council Web site for ideas.

SERVICE UNIT EVENTS

The council is organized into smaller local communities called service units. Each service unit has a monthly leaders meeting to inform leaders and other adults working with Girl Scouts of what is happening and as a place to get support from others. Individual service units sometimes hold special volunteer run events for girls in their area. To find out about leader's meetings or special events in your area, mark the "Let Me Know" box on the enclosed reply card.

JUST FOR GIRL SCOUT DAISIES

Girl Scout Daisies have four different series of awards they can earn. The Girl Scout Daisy Promise Center and Learning Petals; the It's Your World-Change It! Journey, "Welcome to the Daisy Flower Garden"; the It's Your Planet—Love it! Journey, "Between Earth and Sky;" and the It's your Story Tell It! Journey, "5 Flowers, 4 Stories, 3 Cheers for Animals. They can also earn their Bridge to Girl Scout Brownie Award. Below is information on the resources available to guide advisors and girls through the Girl Scout Daisy Program.

DAISY GIRL SCOUT ACTIVITY BOOK

This booklet can be used for fun projects and ideas by the Girl Scout Daisy.

GUIDE FOR DAISY GIRL SCOUT LEADERS

This book can be used by parents or other adult to provide program ideas for earning the Promise Center and Learning Petals plus other ideas for fun Girl Scout activities. This book also has the requirements for earning the Bridge to Girl Scout Brownies Award which helps girls prepare for entering the next level of Girl Scouts.

WELCOME TO THE DAISY FLOWER GARDEN

In this journey for kindergarteners and

first-graders, a favorite pastime—gardening meets the Girl Scout Law. The result is a storybook world of flowers and little girls who, together, do great things. Girl Scout Daisies will especially enjoy meeting the colorful, global characters who teach them to live the Girl Scout Law. The adult "how-to" guide offers Garden Story Time tips, key ideas for garden projects, and all the Girl Scout history and traditions needed for an adventure starring the Amazing Daisy, a new flower friend for Girl Scout Daisies. Girl Scout Daisies can earn three awards over this journey.

BETWEEN EARTH AND SKY

In this journey for kindergarten and first graders, Girl Scout Daisies join their

flower friends for an exciting road trip in a flower powered car. As they travel the country living the values of the Girl Scout Law the girls and their flower friends enjoy what's local and learn why that's important. They experience what's great about what grows near them and they learn how their own special skills make the world a better place. Girl Scout Daisies can earn three awards over this journey.

5 Flowers, 4 Stories, 3 Cheers for Animals!

In the newest Journey (premiering December, 2010) Girl Scout Daisies learn just how much they can care for animals and for themselves—and just how good that makes them feel.

UNIFORMS

All Girl Scout members wear the membership pin when participating in Girl Scout activities. A Girl Scout Daisy wears the Girl Scout Daisy Membership Pin, showing they belong to the Girl Scouts of the USA. This pin is worn on the left side of the Daisy tunic or vest, or on other clothing, centered above the heart or it can be placed on an insignia tab and worn in the same location. It is a daisy cut out inside a trefoil. Girl Scout Daisies may also wear the World Trefoil Pin, signifying their membership in a worldwide movement. Girl Scout Daisies can purchase either a tunic or vest to display Girl Scout Daisy Petals and other insignia. All Girl Scout members are entitled to wear the Girl Scout uniform; however, wearing the uniform is not required unless officially participating in ceremonies or officially representing the Girl Scout movement. Girl Scout Daisies can wear the Girl Scout Daisy tunic or vest over their clothes or purchase a variety of official Girl Scout Daisy uniform components.



GIRL SCOUT DAISY PROMISE CENTER AND LEARNING PETALS

The Promise Center is Daisy blue. The Learning Petals are:

1. Light blue for honest and fair
2. Yellow for friendly and helpful
3. Spring green for considerate and caring
4. Red for courageous and strong
5. Orange for responsible for what to say and do
6. Purple for respect myself and others
7. Magenta for respect authority
8. Green for use resources wisely
9. Rose for make the world a better place
10. Violet for be a sister to every Girl Scout.

Girl Scout Juliettes wear the Juliettes Emblem. The Juliettes Emblem is worn on the sash or vest where troop numbers ordinarily would be. Information on how to wear official insignia can be found in the Girl Scout Catalog on pages 34 & 35 or at www.girlscouts.org/program/gs_central/insignia/.

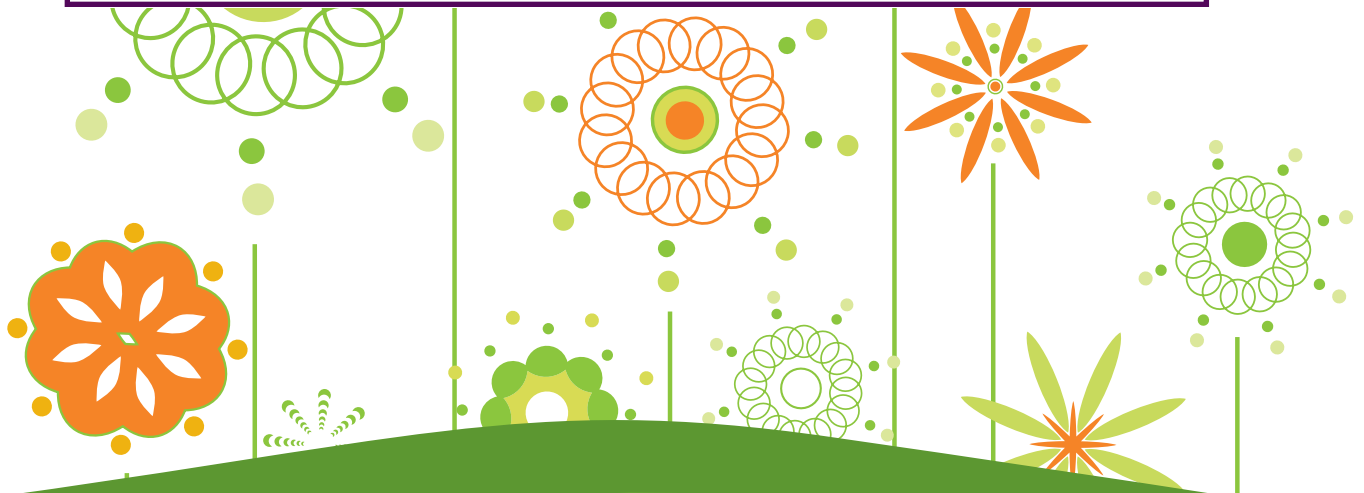
RECEIVING EARNED GIRL SCOUT AWARDS
