I started my Girl Scout journey when I was eight years old—a quiet, timid girl who often struggled to express herself. My parents enrolled me in Girl Scouts, hoping I'd find a place to belong, and they were right. From the moment I joined, welcomed by other Girl Scouts and leaders who saw my potential, I grew with every badge, meeting, and project, finding my voice and learning that I could make a difference.



One of my earliest defining moments came when my troop earned our Girl Scout Bronze Award by transforming an empty patch of dirt into a vibrant school garden. Working side by side with my fellow Girl Scouts taught me something powerful: when people come together with purpose, they can create something lasting. That project helped me realize that I, too, had the ability to make a difference.



It's because of supporters like you that girls like me discover their strengths, their passions, and their purpose.



Years later, when it was time to pursue my Girl Scout Gold Award, I faced a challenge that felt personal. A wildfire had destroyed one of my favorite campgrounds, leaving the land unrecognizable. I wanted to turn that heartbreak into action, so I chose a project focused on restoring green space and rebuilding hope.

I volunteered with the with the Sacramento Tree Foundation and the City of Folsom to plant 25 trees in Handy Family Park—trees that, once fully grown, will remove carbon dioxide, produce oxygen, provide shade, improve health, and help reduce greenhouse gases. I worked with city officials, arborists, and community members to bring the project to life, and on planting day, I led more than 50 volunteers—including younger Girl Scouts—through hours of hard work and joy. Together, we planted every tree and celebrated the promise of a healthier, greener future.


